ADDITIONAL EXPLANATION

Over the past months, I have became more and more familiar with the job of treasurer. As a first accomplishment, I have created an excel bookkeeping program with external help of Niekus, former treasurer of Pegasus. Once the power of excel was with Me, it became easier to do My work accordingly. The start of our year was a bit rough: our former treasurer made her one and only mistake (too bad), so we started with a result of -860 euro's. However, we have been able to recover this amount with positive results from other events, such as our COBO, the Winterformal, an academic seminar and the pubcrawl, an event that unfortunately did not take place.

FOR THIS ASSEMBLY I HAVE ESTIMATED, BASED ON PAST AND FUTURE CASH FLOWS, THAT WE WILL HAVE APPROXIMATELY 1100 EURO'S LEFT IN OUR FIRST HALF YEAR. DESPITE THE ADVISE OF SOME EXPERTS, THE BOARD HAS CHOSEN TO MAKE A PROPOSAL, BASED ON APPLICATIONS, TO REALLOCATE (PART) OF THIS MONEY. THIS MAKES SENSE, SINCE OUR MEMBERS PAID THEIR CONTRIBUTION FOR THIS YEAR, AND THEREFORE I BELIEVE WE SHOULD GIVE THIS AMOUNT OF MONEY ANOTHER 'TRY' TO FINANCE NEW INITIATIVES IN THE SECOND HALF OF OUR YEAR. THREE PROPOSALS WERE SUBMITTED: PARTY COMMITTEE, ACADEMIC & TRAVEL COMMITTEE AND A 'GOODBYE WEEKEND' APPLIED. WE HOPE TO CONVINCE YOU MEMBERS THAT THIS PROPOSED ALLOCATION IS JUSTIFIABLE. Financial Proposal Western Sahara Event

As the AIM Spring Break Trip 2018 is traveling to Morocco, we believe that the Western Sahara conflict is an important issue to address and therefore wish to organise an academic event regarding this topic. The Western Sahara conflict is an ongoing conflict between the Polisario Front and Morocco, which has escalated after Spain withdrew itself from the colonisation of this area. Subsequently, Morocco claimed the Western Sahara as part of its kingdom, whereas the Polisario Front has declared the establishment of the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic (SADR) and has been campaigning to gain independence for the Western Sahara area. Currently, large parts of Western Sahara remain under the control of the Moroccan Government, whereas about 20% of the Western Sahara territory is controlled by SADR. The questions of mutual recognition, establishment of a possible officially recognized Sahrawi state and the large numbers of Sahrawi refugees displaced by the conflict are among the key issues of the ongoing Western Sahara peace process.

We have recently reached out to Erik Hagen, director of the Norwegian Support Committee for Western Sahara, and he was very interested in collaborating in the organization of an informational event about the Western Sahara Conflict for our PPLE-students. The event is most likely going to take place on the 12th of April. He even mentioned that he could possibly bring someone from the Western Sahara region to this event to share his/her experiences.

We believe that the Western Sahara conflict is an important issue that has not been given the attention it deserves and we think it is relevant for a wider public than just the AIM-members joining the Morocco Spring Break Trip. We are therefore collaborating with AIM Academic to turn this into a PPLE-wide event. The event would be mandatory to attend for all students joining the Spring Break Trip as an academic preparation and open for all other PPLE-students. Since using AIM Travel's budget, which consists mainly of the contributions of the students joining the trip, would be at the cost of the trip itself, we think it would be unfair to use this budget for a PPLE-wide event. We are therefore applying for additional funding in order to make this event happen! We are applying for a budget of €95,- that will be used for gifts for the speakers (€30,-), snacks and drinks during/after the event (€50,-) and promotion (€15,-).

We want to ask participants for a monetary contribution of about €60. We hope AIM is both willing and able to contribute to this important event too. Attached you will find a budget estimation, in which we included a contribution from AIM. It would be a pity if we lost sight of each other after graduation. We truly believe that such a weekend would contribute significantly to the establishment of a network of active and engaged PPLE graduates. We sincerely hope you do too.
